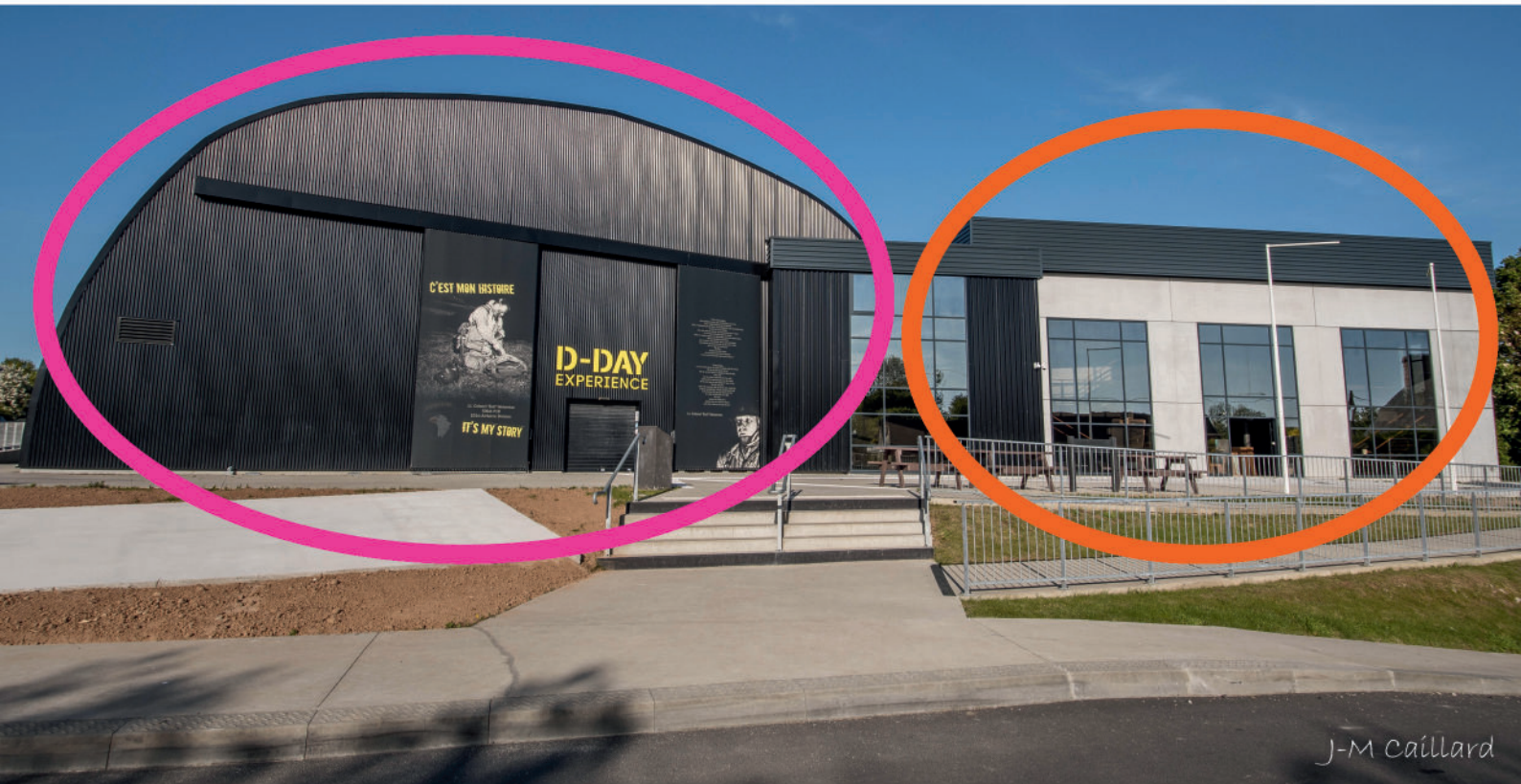


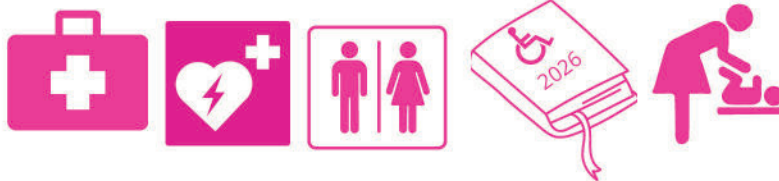

For people who are hard of hearing or deaf



- The museum is fully accessible, with texts for each scene.
- The simulation is also accessible : the plane moves, stimulating several senses.
- The 3D cinema is **not** accessible to deaf people, **but** a cochlear device is available for those who are hard of hearing.

For visually impaired visitors or blind



- The museum **only** provides explanatory texts, which may pose a problem for visually impaired or blind visitors.
- The simulation is accessible : the movements stimulate other senses.
- The 3D cinema is accessible thanks to translations into French, English, Dutch, Spanish and German.

For persons with reduced mobility



- The D-Day Experience, 3D cinema and shops (souvenirs and Paratrooper) are accessible with a lift and wide spaces.
- Access to the simulation is more difficult due to stairs, but if you are able to stand, our team can accompany you.

For people with mental disabilities



- The museum is fully accessible. Despite the theme, none of the scenes are shocking. One scene on the upper floor of the D-Day Experience is very noisy, as are the C-47 with flashes and the 3D cinema.

We would like to draw our visitors' attention to the following points

- The museum's main car park has four disabled parking spaces.
- The road leading to the car park has a continuous slope with no breaks.
- Taxis can drop you off directly in front of the entrance.
- Dead Man's Corner, an unrestored period house, has many stairs and no lift or disabled access. However, disabled access has been provided at the rear of the buildings to view the façade, access the Paratrooper shop and the ground floor of the museum.

Our museum is committed to facilitating access for people with disabilities.

Our trained and sensitive team does its utmost to meet the specific needs of each individual and offer appropriate solutions.

We decided to create a virtual tour of the museum so that everyone can explore it, even if physical disabilities make it difficult to visit in person.

2. SPECIAL RATES ?

We are a private museum and therefore do not receive any government subsidies. Unfortunately, we do not offer preferential rates.

However, when a disability prevents visitors from fully enjoying the museum or its activities, we do decide to offer a commercial gesture.
